## 5. The Hoxne Hoard.

The Hoxne Hoard is the largest 4<sup>th</sup> century hoard of Roman silver and gold ever found in the United Kingdom. On the 16<sup>th</sup> of November 1992 Eric Lawes, a retired gardener, discovered the hoard with a metal detector, in a field on the old Oakley Park Estate near to the site of the Hoxnian Interglacial Lake.

The hoard consists of a large quantity [15000] of gold and silver coins dating from 337 AD -407 AD, depicting 15 different Roman Emperors. All of the items had been buried within a box and of most interest are the items of jewellery including a series of bracelets, rings, gold chains, toiletry implements and a body chain with a coin encased in a decorated mount.



Included in the hoard was a silver tigress handle, once part of a silver vase and a number of bowls and small containers. These include an empress pepperpot [piperatoria] and animal shaped containers. The British Museum has the hoard on display and various publications have been written about this discovery.
